

Fair Chase & Conservation Guidelines – Namibia

1. Fair Chase Principles

- **Definition:** Fair chase is the ethical pursuit of a free-roaming or enclosed animal that retains a natural inclination to escape.
- **Hunting must be done without:**
 - **Artificial light sources.**
 - **Motorized transportation** (hunting from a vehicle is prohibited).
 - **Taking female animals with dependent young.**
- **Ethical Conduct:**
 - Hunters must use proper methods and equipment to minimize animal suffering.
 - Bowhunters should train continuously to improve accuracy and ensure ethical kills.

2. Sustainable Conservation & Wildlife Protection

- **Hunters must contribute to wildlife conservation** by:
 - Supporting biodiversity protection and sustainable use.
 - Following all legal regulations and codes of conduct.
 - Engaging in fair and honest hunting practices.
- **Hunted animals should exist in a naturally interacting, sustainable wild population**, where they can breed and forage freely.
- **Recognizing indigenous community needs:** Hunting should align with rural communities' sustainable resource use and conservation efforts.
